DGMS, Inc. – General Meeting – January 26, 2012

The meeting was called to order at 2:00 p.m. by President Sheila Hoag. She then led the pledge of Allegiance.

Tuesday (the 6th) we finish whatever still needs doing.

Both days, coffee and donuts are provided for the morning break, around 10:00 a.m. Lunch is on your own.

This year, Jerry Abbey will head the general set up crew, Sally Hansen and Sheila Hoag the display cases, Barbara Hamilton and Doris Miller the Field Trip trailer, Susan Schiffner and Art Krasinski the dealer spaces. The more help we have, the easier and quicker the job gets done. There are tasks for everyone; some that can be done while sitting and not involving manual labor, and even running errands (cuz we always forget to bring something).

Wednesday is the day the dealers arrive and start setting up their booths.

Thursday through Sunday is Show Time! Many tasks need your help during the show . . . Membership, Information tables, spinning wheel, Geode cutting, bucket brigade (to pick up auction donations from the dealers), some people to make announcements over the PA, and many other things that may come up.

Deming Gem & Mineral Society — Board Meeting Minutes – February 1, 2012

The Board meeting was called to order by Pres. Shelia Hoag. Members present were VP Marilyn Page, Treas. Susan Schiffner, Bulletin Ed. Carolyn Abbey, Roundup Maurice and Judy Crawford, Past Pres. Frank Barber, Shop: Joe Morone. Guests were Ernie Bent and Lloyd Page.

Treasurer: Susan gave her report on the Accounts. Books were audited and everything balances out.

Joe reported that the trim saw blades are wearing out quite fast. He suggested going to a 10" blade which costs a little more, but would last a lot longer that the thin blades they have now. Board ok'ed.

Joe stated while shop is closed he will see about the leak in the roof, also he would like to run water pipes back and forth on the back wall to aid in heating up the water for the grinders. He is trying to be frugal with the propane as the cost is quite high right now.

The Loratone saw is all fixed and painted for Roundup. 700 lbs of rocks were tumbled last year and a lot is unaccounted for. A book will be used to keep track of the rocks. You must sign out by weight or volume for anyone needing tumbled rocks. 250 lbs. will be set aside for the Roundup. The grit used for this project is expensive but needed. Susan made a motion to purchase the grit and Maurice seconded. Passed.

Red Roof Rock Shop has a large saw blade for sale at \$715, never used. This will be a savings of over \$300. Board OK's the purchase.

Remember, shop closes for Roundup on March 3rd and will be open again on March 19th.

Cab beading class will be Feb. 7, 14, 21 & 28, from 9-12.

Bulletin will be a little late as General Minutes are not yet available to be published.

Claims are all set for the Roundup and papers filed.

Roundup: Going to get TV stations to run announcements and also the radio stations in the surrounding area. Next meetings are February 11th and 25th.

Old business:

Gold panning group held their meeting and several of the board members joined the DGMS. They had over 30 people present.

New Business:

Maurice made a motion that Wayne Treers and Jim Foutch be reimbursed 37 cents per mile for official field trips sanctioned by the club. Susan seconded. Passed.

Due to postage and other rises in the cost to run the club, motion made by Maurice and 2nd by Joe to raise the dues \$2.00 next year, beginning this July. The dues from July to Dec. will then be \$6. Passed.

Gravel around the building needs to be leveled. Looking for a donation of 6-8 ft. piece of chain link fencing to be used in making a drag. Contact Joe at the Shop.

Age limit for children using the shop was discussed and was decided that the age would be 10 years and over, and the child must be able to reach grinders, etc. without the use of stools, etc. Joe will see about a height limit. All officers present agreed.

Meeting adjourned at 3:20 p.m.




