Peppers receipts can be turned into the club for 1% refund from Peppers, and the money goes to DGMS. Bring in your receipts and they'll be turned in monthly.


We are still collecting plastic caps for Bell schools.

The meeting was called to order at 2:10 p.m. by President, Marilyn Page, who then led the Pledge of Allegiance.

There was no Secretary's report. The minutes from the last two meetings will be published in the Chips Bulletin.

No Treasurer's report.

Shop report: Wheels will be redressed once a month. Shop hours are currently Monday and Friday's 9 a.m. til noon; Wednesday from noon until 3 p.m., and again from 6 til 9 p.m. If we find someone to run the shop, it can be open on Saturdays. The number of persons working in the shop at one time will be per the New Mexico State guidelines (due to Covid).

There was a discussion as to minimum paying customers to hold shop open; amount to pay for shop use; leaders and sawyers being allowed free time for their work; shop rules being in writing; etc. It was determined that everyone will pay for shop time, \$1.00 per hour/3.00 per session. Voted on and passed. For safety (insurance) reasons, no one can work in the shop alone. There needs to be a second person in the building.

The General meeting in November and December will be on the third Thursday instead of the usual fourth Thursday.

Judy Murphy presented two Fossil Posters, she purchased, for the shop; they will go in front of the Fossils displays. Motion made to reimburse her for the poster cost. Passed.

It was discussed to use the Board meeting to cover more business, and have Committee Chairs reports given then, and abbreviate the business of the general meeting, thus allowing time for programs. The Treasurer's report will then be posted on the bulletin board.

The need to re-organize the bulletin board was discussed.

According to the NM Governor's Secretary we can go ahead and schedule our Rockhound Roundup, so we will go ahead with scheduling it and advertising.

November 19th at 1 p.m. (just before the General meeting) will be the next Roundup meeting.

We will have a demonstration of flint knapping by Grant and Shirley, from Albuquerque, at the November 19th General meeting.

LED bulbs not ordered yet, Marvin still working on them, Bill still working on new tire tumbler for back of the shop.

Bill G. is asking for donations of prizes, for the Rockhound Roundup Metal Detecting contest, of coins, mineral specimens, polished geodes, antique bottles, and antiques of most kinds.

FIELD TRIP SAFETY RULES

- 1. Never go on a Field Trip alone. Have someone along who can help, or summon help, if necessary. Take lots of water, coats, sunscreen, trash bags, sanitary items, hand tools for digging, etc. Layer clothing, wear bright colors, wear a hat.
- 2. If you bring children, have the them within seeing and talking distance. A child not only could get lost, but could encounter a snake, scorpion, etc. or have an accident of some sort.
- 3. Do not collect directly above or underneath people where there might be danger of falling rock.
- 4. Park so that all the cars can get out. Do not block the road way.
- 5. If you are going to leave the Field Trip early, notify the person in charge.
- 6. Break any cigarette before discarding, and then crush it on the bare ground.
- 7. Do not throw rocks, and do not allow children to do so.
- 8. Avoid old mine tunnels or shafts. NEVER go into an old mine. Just ask yourself, "Is that rock or mineral I might find inside, worth the chance taken, if I'm not around to enjoy it."
- 9. Respect property rights and signs. Obtain permission to enter property if owned by private persons or company owned.
 - a) Inquire if there are vicious animals in the fields.
 - b) Never walk on newly planted or cultivated fields without special permission.
 - c) Be extremely cautious in hunting near abandoned buildings. You may stumble into a deep well not properly covered.
 - d) Refill any holes you dig, so people or animals might not fall in.
- 10. Respect another's diggings. If a person has left for lunch or for any other reason with the intention of returning, and has left a pick, coat, or definite marker, find another place.
- 11. Leave any place in good condition. Don't leave papers, cans, etc. lying around to mar the beauty of the place, and to tell others you have been there. Pick up trash you see that others may have left.
- 12. BLM Rule: If a gate is open leave it, if it is closed, close it.
- 13. Never eat wild berries unless you are absolutely sure they are safe.
- 14. Be able to recognize poison ivy, poison oak, etc. Should there be any doubt, DON'T TOUCH.
- 15. Always be alert for snakes, scorpions, etc. Be very cautious where you put your feet and hands and always check out a bush or rock with a walking stick before walking by, stepping over, or reaching under.




