Each year I believe it is good to revisit the Rockhounds Code of Ethics. New information for the new Rockhounds and a good review for the well seasoned ones., so all of you please read them over.

#### **Code of Ethics**

I will respect both private and public property and will do no collecting on privately owned land without permission of the owner.

I will keep informed on all laws, regulations or rules governing collecting on public lands and will observe them.

I will, to the best of my ability, ascertain the boundary lines of property on which I plan to collect.

I will use no firearms or blasting material in collecting areas.

I will cause no willful damage to property of any kind such as fences, signs, buildings, etc.

I will leave all gates as found.

I will build fires only in designated or safe places and will be certain they are completely extinguished before leaving the area.

I will discard no burning material - matches, cigarettes, etc.

I will fill all excavation holes which may be dangerous to livestock.

I will not contaminate wells, creeks, or other water supplies.

I will cause no willful damage to collecting material and will take home only what I can reasonably use.

I will practice conservation and undertake to utilize fully and well the materials I have collected and will recycle my surplus for the pleasure and benefit of others.

I will support the rockhound project H.E.L.P. (Help Eliminate Litter Please) and will leave all collecting areas devoid of litter, regardless of how found.

I will cooperate with field-trip leaders and those in designated authority in all collecting areas.

I will report to my club or federation officers, Bureau of Land Management or other authorities, any deposit of petrified wood or other materials on public lands which should be protected for the enjoyment of future generations for public educational and scientific purposes.

I will appreciate and protect our heritage of natural resources.

I will observe the "Golden Rule", will use Good Outdoor Manners and will at all times conduct myself in a manner which will add to the stature and Public Image of Rockhounds everywhere.

# Shop stuff

EDITOR'S NOTE: The source of these tips and hints are other club bulletins. Be careful when trying out any new idea. They have not all been tried by this editor.

Polish metal and stones with an electric shoe polisher! Remove the existing shoe polisher brushes, attach a spindle on each shaft end, and then install polishing buffs. Don't forget to obtain right and left hand thread spindles so that the buffs won't spin of. Most shoe polishers spin slowly, just right for polishing.

The ideal tumbling load is slightly less than 3/4 full. Use only enough water to fill the voids between the stones with no more than 1/8 of an inch over the top of the stones. Use only enough abrasive to cover the surface areas of the stones. This usually takes about one pound of #100 grit for each 8 lbs. of rock. This may even be further reduced as the #400 and #600 grit is used, as the finer particles possess more surface area and 3/4 lb. of grit with 8 lbs. of rock is usually sufficient.

If you put Vaseline around the rim of your tumbler before bolting on the lid, you will get a tighter seal and an easily removable lid. You can do the same on a tube of epoxy; the cap will not stick or cause trouble when you want to use the epoxy again. Tip for tumblers: If you are lacking tumbler pellets for your final polish, try using a package or two of rubber bands, available at most stores. They work well and can be reused.

#### Deming Gem & Mineral Society Board Meeting Minutes – January 6, 2021

The meeting was called to order at 2:10 p.m. by Vice President, Nancy Guernsey standing in for President Darrow who was ill. Nancy then led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Marilyn motioned that notes from last meeting be accepted as published in the Chips newsletter, seconded, passed.

Donna said budget remaining relatively static, collection of some dues has taken place, and members are urged to mail their dues to DGMS, PO BOX 1459, DEMING, NM 88031. Donna also said there will be a meeting for budget oriented matters scheduled soon.

Carolyn to make further mention of the dues in the newsletter with our mailing address for members to mail in. It was considered to be more of a necessity because we usually collect a lot of dues at roundup, which of course is cancelled for this year.

The issue of the copiers was brought up and both copiers are DGMS copiers, but we now own the old one with just a maintenance contract, and the new copier is a color copier with a price per page that is very reasonable (7Cents).

Marilyn made a motion that access to the color copier be limited and this was generally agreed upon as a matter of office access. Passed.

Members are urged to use to classifieds in the newsletter to advertise what they have and what they need. The cost is \$5 for three bulletin issues.

Carolyn stated that most all of the inside vendors have been contacted about the 2021 cancellation, and that we plan on having a Roundup in 2022. Only three vendors were unable to attend in 2022. All of the rest will have their contracts rolled over for 2022, or new ones send to those as yet not paid for.

Art has been contacting the Outside vendors with mostly the same result.

Bill reported on the Shop. Clean up and maintenance to take precedence over saw use for awhile, though members can still get their rocks cut by leaving them plainly labeled on the carts by the scale at the back of the shop.

Sawing fees came up and more discussion is needed. It is

agreed the biggest saw should only be used for rocks that cannot be cut by any of the other saws.

We need a field trip coordinator, and more field tripping overall for all members interested.




Meeting was adjourned at 3:10 p.m.

# What do you do with all that scrap rock?... Make Pavers (Stepping stones)

A wooden frame can be screwed together for under \$10 using 1x4's. Lubricate the sides and bottom pan with waste oil to prevent sticking. I use a thin sheet of wall paneling to line the bottom. Lay steel fencing wire in the bottom of each one to make them sturdy and less likely to crack.


Mix Portland Cement, Sand and type S Lime making sure it's thick enough to support the stones. Smooth the surface and tap the stones, rail spikes, horse shoes etc. in to where they are at or just below the surface. Let sit for at least 12 hours before attempting to remove the mold, allow another 12 hours before setting them in the ground.


