Let's Talk Claims - Lesson 1, by Sherry Wilson

Types of Claims for DGMS

A mining claim is a parcel of land for which the claimant has asserted a right of possession and the right to develop and extract a discovered, valuable, mineral deposit. There are three basic types of minerals on federally-administered lands: locatable, leasable, and salable. Locatable minerals include both metallic minerals (gold, silver, lead, etc.) and nonmetallic minerals (fluorspar, asbestos, mica, etc.). It is nearly impossible to list all locatable minerals.

Types of Claims that DGMS holds with BLM

Lode Claims - Deposits subject to lode claims include classic veins or lodes having well-defined boundaries. They also include other rock in- place bearing valuable minerals and may be broad zones of mineralized rock. Examples include quartz or other veins bearing gold or other metallic minerals and large volume, but low-grade disseminated gold deposits. Descriptions are by metes and bounds surveys beginning at the discovery point on the claim and including a reference to natural objects or vpermanent monuments. Federal statute limits their size to a maximum of 1500 feet in length, and a maximum width of 600 feet (300 feet on either side of the vein).

Placer Claims - Placer claims are defined as deposits not located with a lode claim, should be appropriated by a placer location. Placer claims, where practicable, are located by legal subdivision. In the United States, a **placer claim** grants to the discoverer that are contained in loose material such as sand or gravel the right to mine on public **land**.

DGMS has two areas on BLM land. Both have a Lode Claim and a Placer Claim.
