

Sunday, Sept 22nd, Larry & Rose will lead a trip to the Gage area. Meet at the Deming Truck stop (west of town) at 9 a.m. Need a high clearance vehicle.

Discussion on having First Aide kits on field trips, and also suggesting people bring a whistle with them in case they get separated from the group and need help.
